

The Language Charter is an intrinsic part of life at ysgol Llandygai and the commitment shown by all involved with the school is invaluable in addressing the Charter's requirements.

The school's vision is to encourage use of Welsh in a social context to nurture confident bilingual pupils. Since the Charter's launch in 2011, the school's outcome star that reflects the pupils questionnaires data, states that an astounding development in pupils use of Welsh within a social context has certainly impacted pupils achievements in the classroom.

Around 13% of the school's pupils speak Welsh at home and our aim is to motivate parents/guardians and members of the community to try and use the language. Judging or focusing on accuracy is not the aim but rather inspire all of the school's stakeholders to make the fullest possible use of Welsh in social situations.

We annually encourage and support parents to learn Welsh and there is an increasing interest to do so annually.

Very fortunately, the School Council's imagination and enthusiasm provides support for the Language Charter. At their meetings, discussion of the Charter is an important part of their agenda to develop ideas, think about creative strategies and try and instill enthusiasm and curiosity amongst the school's stakeholders to speak Welsh. Consequently, the pupils work has received considerable press attention and we have welcomed several visitors from all corners of the world to the school to learn more about our work with the Charter.

Following discussions at School Council meetings, the character 'Cled Celt', our Welsh hero at the school, has been created. Cled is a likeable, mischievous character, who supports and encourages those who attend the school to use Welsh. As Cled said-Welsh opens doors!

Reaching the Summit
